WHEREAS, when General Order No. 107 was adopted by the Court, it was the intention of the Court to provide a bail forfeiture plan that would make appearances by persons charged with certain minor offenses unnecessary if such persons preferred to post bail and forfeit the same to avoid the inconvenience of an appearance in answer to a citation, and

WHEREAS, from time to time it becomes necessary to add or delete named violations to or from the Order or to amend the Order to reflect changes made by new legislation, and

WHEREAS, General Order No. 107A provides that such additions or deletions may be made to or from General Order 107 from time to time by the Chief Judge with the concurrence of the Magistrate Judges Committee,

IT IS ORDERED that the attached Uniform Collateral Forfeiture Schedule be made a part of General Order No. 107, dated May 27, 1971, and General Order 107A, dated September 16, 1972.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk shall place a copy of this Order and the attached Uniform Collateral Forfeiture Schedule in the Book of General Orders following General Orders No. 107. The Clerk is also directed to make said schedule readily accessible on the Court's internet and intranet sites.

#### Mandatory Appearance in Court (MA)

In all cases where a bail amount is listed or MA is listed in the alternative to a bail, a mandatory appearance may be required at the discretion of the citing officer when:

- (1) The commission of the offense involved loss or damage or a substantial threat to the safety of persons, animals, resources, the ecosystem, or property; or
- (2) The offender committed or was charged with the same or similar offense on a prior occasion

#### Assimilative Crimes Act (18 U.S.C. 13)

When adopting State regulations or offenses, the "Base Fine" amount of the current California Uniform Bail and Penalty Schedule is to be used.

## Offenses Not on Uniform Schedule

For unlisted offenses, the forfeiture shall be 100/MA
