GENERAL ORDER NO. 107 A

WHEREAS, when General Order No. 107 was adopted by the Court it was the intention of the Court to provide a bail forfeiture plan which would make appearances by persons charged with certain minor offenses unnecessary if such persons preferred to post bail and forfeit the same to avoid the inconvenience of an appearance in answer to a citation; and

WHEREAS, at the time of the adoption of General Order No. 107 it was not possible to ascertain all of the offenses to be listed therein; and

WHEREAS, from time to time it becomes necessary to add or delete named violations to or from the Order;

IT IS ORDERED that such additions or deletions may be made to or from General Order No. 107 from time to time by the Chief Judge with the concurrence of the Magistrates Committee.
