administration of the oath of citizenship,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the following policy regarding naturalization ceremonies shall be adopted by the Central District of California:

- 1. When approval of the Chief Judge is obtained, special arrangements may be made for the swearing in of particular persons: (1) with serious health problems; (2) who are severely disabled; or (3) who have other special needs. Further, the Chief Judge may approve ceremonies for one or a few persons upon the request of a judge.
- 2. Subject to the exceptions set forth above in paragraph 1, and in order to treat all candidates in a fair and equitable manner, requests to conduct special ceremonies in particular political jurisdictions or at military installations cannot be granted. It is not possible to conduct naturalization ceremonies in each jurisdiction or at every military installation, given the number of political subdivisions and military installations in the Central District.
- 3. Subject to the exceptions set forth above in paragraph 1, and in order to treat the large number of diverse nationalities and ethnicities represented in the Central District in a fair and equitable manner, requests to conduct special ceremonies only for persons from a particular country of origin or for a particular ethnic group cannot be granted. A naturalization ceremony in the Central District frequently includes 4,000 or more candidates from 100 or more different countries of origin.
- 4. Subject to the exceptions set forth above in paragraph 1, and in order to spend available resources promoting prompt service to candidates, requests to conduct special ceremonies at particular locations cannot be granted. Many factors must be considered when selecting the facility for a ceremony, including cost, availability, lighting, sound systems, staging and seating room, parking access, participant safety, convenience to candidates, and efficient use of staff. The Court does not have the resources available to conduct pre-ceremony site surveys and to prepare site operation plans for every new facility requested.
