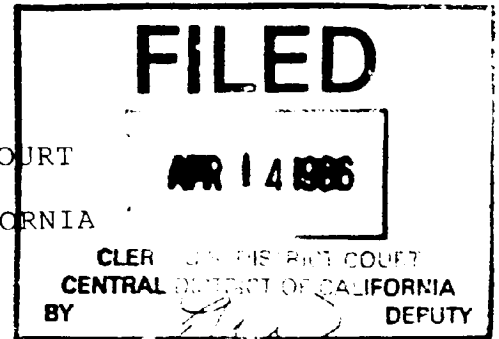

GENERAL ORDER NO. 194-H

A. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that General Order No. 194 be amended as follows:

1. Part One, Section I, Civil Matters, is amended by adding under subsection A, the following: "20. Warrants of arrest pursuant to Rules C(3) and E(4)(f), Supplemental Rules for Certain Admiralty and Maritime Claims (Rule 1.7.21)."

2. Part One, Section II, Criminal Matters, is amended by amending paragraph 13 to read as follows: "13. Fix or modify bail and conduct detention hearings and issue release and detention orders as provided in Rule 2.19."

B. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Local Rules Governing Duties of Magistrates, which are included as an attachment to General Order No. 194 be amended as follows:

1. Section 1.7, Certain Other Civil Matters, add after paragraph .20 Writs of Possession, the following: ".21 Warrants of Arrest, Consider applications for orders stating that conditions for an in rem action appear to exist and authorizing warrants of arrest pursuant to Rule C(3), and

conduct post-arrest hearings under Rule E(4)(f), Supplemental Rules for Certain Admiralty and Maritime Claims."

2. Add to Local Rule 2.19.08 after "To fix or modify bail" the following: "and conduct detention hearings and issue release and detention orders, as provided by 18 U.S.C. §3142(f), (h) & (i);"

3. Add the following paragraph immediately after paragraph 2.19.08.081:

.0811 If the first appearance of a defendant pursuant to an arrest on an indictment is before a magistrate prior to the scheduled post-indictment arraignment, upon the continuance of a detention hearing pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3142(f) beyond the time of assignment of the case to a District Judge, the magistrate shall retain the case for determination of the detention or release of the defendant, unless otherwise ordered by the District Judge to whom the case has been assigned.
