GENERAL ORDER NO. 205

WHEREAS, violations of parking regulations and ordinances, as enumerated in General Order 107, 107A, and amendments thereto, are matters in which a person charged with such offenses may post collateral in lieu of personal appearance, waive appearance before a U.S. Magistrate, and consent to forfeiture of bail, thereby incurring the equivalent of a conviction of the traffic violations, as required by state statute, and

WHEREAS, this Court is authorized to utilize the services of the Unpaid Parking Violation Program of the State of California Department of Motor Vehicles to register the violation notices and to collect fines for parking violations issued by federal agencies and which are within the jurisdiction of this Court (California Vehicle Code §§41102, and 41103.5, as amended September 13, 1979); Good cause appearing therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that upon failure to appear or to post collateral for parking violations issued within the federal jurisdiction of the Central District of California, the

registered owner of the cited vehicle shall be subject to having the violation recorded with the California Department of Motor Vehicles Unpaid Parking Violation Program and the registration of that vehicle withheld until a proper disposition of the case is made, or authorized under California Vehicle Code Section 41103.5. This order shall apply to all parking violations contained in General Order 107, 107A, and any amendments thereto.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of Court shall collect a prescribed administrative service fee on each paid parking violation disposition which had been registered with the Department of Motor Vehicles and which is made to this Court, and shall remit the collected administrative fees to the Accounting Section of the California Department of Motor Vehicles.
