

Weighted Filings per Judgeship



The number of weighted filings per judgeship for the Central District of California remained high at 567 for fiscal year² ("FY") 2016, an increase of 4.4 percent from 542 a year ago. The national average was 483 weighted filings per judgeship. The Central District of California ranked 14th in the nation and third in the Ninth Circuit for weighted filings in fiscal year 2016.

¹ Case weights are based on the new district court case weighting system approved by the Judicial Conference of the United States at its March 2016 session.

² The fiscal year is the 12-month period ending September 30.



In fiscal year 2016, the Central District of California saw a 2.3 percent increase in combined civil and criminal case filings, from 15,241 cases in 2015 to 15,591 cases filed in 2016. Total case terminations were 15,429, an increase of .4 percent from 15,367 in 2015. Pending cases totaled 11,961, an increase of 1.5 percent from 11,790 in 2015. During the five-year period ending September 30, 2016, total civil and criminal case filings decreased by 8.7 percent from 17,086 to 15,591; total terminations declined by 9.2 percent from 16,986 to 15,429; and total pending cases dropped by 7 percent from 12,856 to 11,961.


A total of 14,731 civil cases were filed in fiscal year 2016, an increase of 1.3 percent from the 14,549 filings in fiscal year 2015. During the five-year period ending September 30, 2016, civil case filings, terminations, and pending civil cases were at their highest in 2012. From 2012 to 2016, civil filings decreased overall by 6.4 percent from 15,739 to 14,731; civil terminations decreased by 5.8 percent from 15,653 to 14,741; and pending civil cases decreased by 7.3 percent from 10,728 to 9,941.





Between fiscal year 2012 and 2015, the total number of criminal case filings and criminal defendant filings in the Central District of California had declined. In fiscal year 2016, criminal case filings in the district increased 24.3 percent from 692 to 860 and filings for criminal defendants increased 14.8 percent from 1087 to 1248.






Civil Case Filings



Civil rights case filings constituted the highest percentage of all civil case filing categories at 20 percent in fiscal year 2016. Fewer personal injury/product liability, forfeiture and penalty, and Social Security cases were filed; however, there were more civil rights, antitrust, and real property cases filed compared to the previous fiscal year. In fiscal year 2016, copyright, patent, and trademark cases increased 4.7 percent from 1,392 to 1,457.



Civil Removal Filings



Civil removal filings represented 24 percent of the total filings in the Central District of California. 65 percent of the removals were filed in the Western Division; 16 percent were filed in the Southern Division; and 19 percent were filed in the Eastern Division. The largest percentage of civil removal filings were real property cases (32 percent) and civil rights cases (17 percent).



14 percent (1,989) of the 14,731 total civil cases filed in fiscal year 2016 were non-prisoner cases with at least one pro se party.³ Of these, 63 percent were civil rights and real property cases. 8.3 percent (1,219) of non-prisoner pro se filings had a least one pro se plaintiff. 5.7 percent (839) had at least one pro se defendant, of which 883 were removal cases.

³ The number of non-prisoner pro se filings is based on data in the Central District of California's Case Management/Electronic Case Filing System and reflects non-prisoner cases filed in fiscal year 2016 that had at least one party with a pro se status entered as of March 20, 2017.


Criminal Defendant Filings



In fiscal year 2016, criminal defendant filings increased 14.8 percent from fiscal year 2015. The top three major offense categories for criminal defendant filings in fiscal year 2016 were property offenses (40 percent), drug offenses (25 percent), and firearms and explosives offenses (11 percent). The number of defendants charged with property offenses increased by 45.7 percent from 337 to 491, the number of defendants charged with drug offenses decreased by 6.2 percent from 337 to 316, and the number of defendants charged with immigration offenses decreased by 33.8 percent from 139 to 92.



Criminal Defendant Filings by Major Offense





Civil Case Filings Referred to Magistrate Judges for Report and Recommendation



In fiscal year 2016, 21 percent of the total civil filings were referred to magistrate judges for report and recommendations. Of the 3,043 cases referred for report and recommendations, 43.5 percent were habeas corpus petitions, 27.7 percent were Social Security appeal cases, 19.2 percent were prisoner civil rights cases, approximately 8 percent were non-prisoner pro se civil rights cases, and 1 percent were other cases referred for report and recommendations.

Consents to Magistrate Judges



Parties consented to proceed before magistrate judges in a total of 1006 cases in calendar year 2016, a 14.7 percent decrease from 1154 cases in 2015. Of this total, all parties consented in 893 cases that were referred to a magistrate judge for a report and recommendation; all parties consented in 35 cases assigned to magistrate judges through the Direct Assignment of Civil Cases to Magistrate Judges program; and all parties consented to proceed before magistrate judges in 76 cases through the Voluntary Consent List of Civil Cases to Magistrate Judges Program.



In calendar year 2016, magistrate judges held 386 settlement conferences in 339 cases. Of these, the magistrate judges settled 187 cases, for a 55.2 percent settlement rate. The magistrate judges spent a total of 2200.05 hours, equivalent to 275 days, working on settling these cases.

In calendar year 2016, 2,887 cases were referred to ADR. The Central District of California's Mediation Panel is composed of 231 panel members who collectively possess substantive experience in 24 areas of law. Panel mediators conducted mediation sessions in 682 cases. Of these, 338 cases were resolved or partially resolved, resulting in a settlement rate of 50 percent for cases mediated by the Panel. As of February 2017, twenty-seven District Judges in the Central District participate in the Court Directed ADR Program.

The Prisoner Settlement Program provides for the referral of certain prisoner civil rights cases to Magistrate Judge Victor E. Bianchini, recalled Magistrate Judge to the Central and Southern Districts of California, for settlement proceedings at various California state prisons. In 2016, Judge Bianchini mediated 34 cases in the Central District of California and settled 30 cases, resulting in a settlement rate of 88 percent.

In calendar year 2016, six judges participated in the Patent Pilot Program in the Central District of California. In 2016, the judges designated to receive patent cases under the Patent Pilot Program received 172 patent cases, of which 47 were initially assigned to them, 64 cases were transferred to the program from non-participating judges, and 61 cases were transferred to the program as a result of related case transfers or other reasons. The number of patent cases filed in calendar year 2016 increased by 1.9 percent, but the number of cases transferred to the program by non-participating judges declined by 14 percent from 2015. The percentage of patent cases filed that were assigned or transferred to patent pilot program judges was 63 percent in 2016. Since the program started in September of 2011, a total of 1107 patent cases had been included in the program by the end of 2016.
