2	A. <u>Responsive Pleadings to GE Complaints.</u>		
3			
4	As previously ordered (Docket No. 282), Defendants shall respond to the		
5	Consolidated Governmental Entities Complaint (the "CGEC") by January 8, 2024.		
6	Except for City of Chicago (Docket No. 243), the Court stays the time for		
7	Defendants' response to any other follow on/tag along case until the Court and the		
8	parties have had an opportunity at the next status conference to discuss how the		
9	pleading stage for these actions should be handled.

11	B. Initial Disclosures.		
12			
13	The parties shall exchange initial disclosures as provided for under Rule 26(a)(1)		
14	on or before February 15, 2024.

16	C. <u>Discovery</u>		
17			
18	Structural Discovery and Foundational Discovery.		
19			
20	The parties shall discuss and agree on the scope of discoverable information,		
21	search methodologies, and the lists of search terms, custodians, and date ranges for		
22	Electronically Stored Information. Also as part of this process, the parties may		
23	pursue discovery concerning the organization of the governmental entities that are at		
24	issue on the Plaintiffs' side, as well as of the Defendants, through a disclosure		
25	process, focused requests for production, written discovery, and/or Rule 30(b)(6)
