ORDER OF THE CHIEF JUDGE
22-096

WHEREAS on March 29, 2020, Order of the Chief Judge No. 20-043 was issued authorizing the use of video and telephonic conference technology in certain criminal proceedings under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (“CARES Act”);

WHEREAS all findings and authorizations in Order of the Chief Judge No. 20-043 have been previously extended through Orders of the Chief Judge Nos. 20-080, 20-097, 20-186, 21-031, 21-060, 21-065, 21-073, 21-105, 21-124, and 22-045;

WHEREAS the emergency authority granted under the CARES Act has not been terminated; and

WHEREAS the authorizations granted in Order of the Chief Judge No. 20-043 continue to be warranted;

1 Acting pursuant to Section 15002(b) of the CARES Act and having conducted
2 the necessary review, I hereby extend all findings and authorizations in Order of the
3 Chief Judge No. 20-043 until July 27, 2022, unless terminated earlier. If the
4 emergency persists at that time, I will review the situation for further extension of
5 authority pursuant to the provisions of the CARES Act.
