### Weighted Filings per Judgeship



The number of weighted filings per judgeship for the Central District of California rose to 702 for fiscal year<sup>1</sup> ("FY") 2020, an increase of 3 percent from 681 a year ago. Weighted filings have increased 24 percent over the five-year period from FY2016 to FY2020. The national average was 681 weighted filings per judgeship. The Central District of California ranked 8<sup>th</sup> in the nation and 1<sup>st</sup> in the Ninth Circuit for weighted filings in FY2020.

The Central District of California has 28 authorized Article III judgeships. At the end of FY2020, the Central District had seven vacancies, more than double from FY2016. The oldest vacancy is from October 29, 2015. At the end of FY2020, the number of vacant judgeship months was the highest in the Court's history at 113.9 months. During the five-year period ending September 30, 2020, vacant judgeship months surged 266 percent from 31.1 in FY2016 to 113.9 in FY2020. Vacant judgeship months are the total number of months that vacancies occurred in any judgeship position in a circuit or district.

In FY2020, the Central District of California saw a 3.7 percent increase in combined civil and criminal case filings from FY2019. Total case terminations increased 3 percent, and total pending cases increased 3.5 percent from FY2019. During the five-year period ending September 30, 2020, total civil and criminal case filings increased by 10.8 percent; total terminations increased by 8.4 percent, and total pending cases rose 18.8 percent.

A total of 16,461 civil cases were filed in FY2020, an increase of 6.1 percent from 15,514 in FY2019. Terminations increased 4.9 percent, and pending civil cases increased 3.9 percent from FY2019. During the five-year period ending September 30, 2020, civil case filings increased 11.7 percent, terminations increased 8.7 percent, and pending civil cases rose 17.7 percent, representing five-year highs.

Between FY2016 and FY2020, the total number of criminal case filings decreased 5.8 percent, and criminal defendant filings increased 2.3 percent, while criminal cases pending increased 23.9 percent. In FY2020, the significant drop in criminal filings was due to COVID-19 when grand jury proceedings were suspended intermittently between March and September, criminal case filings decreased 28.8 percent, and filings for criminal defendants decreased 42.6 percent from FY2019. In FY2020, criminal case terminations in the Central District of California decreased 28 percent; terminations for criminal defendants decreased 21.3 percent; pending criminal cases increased 1.5 percent; and, pending criminal defendants decreased 3.7 percent from FY2019.

#### **Civil Case Filings**



Civil rights case filings constituted the highest percentage of all civil case filing categories at 36.8 percent in FY2020. There were more civil rights, all other civil, and contracts filed in FY2020; however, there were significantly fewer personal injury/product liability, and real property cases filed compared to FY2019. In FY2020, social security increased 24.2 percent, torts (other than personal injury/product liability) increased 21.2 percent, civil rights increased 17.6 percent, and contracts increased 13.7 percent from FY2019.

The Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) Civil Rights filings in FY 2020 comprised 26.1 percent of California Central District's total civil filings. From FY 2019 to FY 2020, ADA filings increased 27.3 percent, and over the five-year period, from FY 2016 to FY 2020, ADA filings have increased 213.6 percent. ADA filings have surged, and from FY 2016 through FY 2020, while total civil filings increased 11.7 percent, the percentage of ADA filings to total civil filings have increased 180.6 percent.



#### **Civil Removal Filings**



A total of 3,280 civil removal cases were filed in FY2020, a decrease of 9.5 percent from FY2019. Civil removal filings represented 19.6 percent of the total filings in the Central District of California: 69 percent of the removals were filed in the Western Division; 15 percent were filed in the Southern Division; and, 16 percent were filed in the Eastern Division. The largest percentage of civil removal filings were contracts (31 percent) and civil rights (25 percent) cases.



#### **Non-Prisoner Pro Se Filings**



8 percent of the 16,461 total civil cases filed in FY2020 were non-prisoner cases with at least one pro se party.<sup>2</sup> Of these, 58 percent were civil rights and real property cases.

#### **Criminal Defendant Filings**



In FY2020, criminal defendant filings decreased 42.6 percent from FY2019. The top three major offense categories for criminal defendant filings in FY2020 were drug offenses (34.8 percent), property offenses (25.9 percent), and firearms and explosives offenses (15.6 percent). The number of defendants charged with drug offenses decreased by 47.6 percent, the number of defendants charged with property offenses decreased by 44.6 percent, and the number of defendants charged with immigration offenses decreased by 41.6 percent from FY2019.

#### **Civil Case Filings Referred to Magistrate Judges for Report and Recommendation**



In FY2020, 18.2 percent of the total civil filings were referred to Magistrate Judges for report and recommendations. Of the cases referred for report and recommendations, 35.7 percent were habeas corpus petitions, 36.7 percent were Social Security appeal cases, 18.7 percent were prisoner civil rights cases, 9.1 percent were non-prisoner pro se civil rights cases, and 1 percent were other cases referred for report and recommendations.



#### **Consents to Magistrate Judges**



12-Month Period Ending December 31, 2020

Parties consented to proceed before Magistrate Judges in a total of 1,154 cases in calendar year 2020, a 36.1 percent increase from 2019. Of this total, all parties consented in 1,012 cases that were referred to a Magistrate Judge for a report and recommendation; all parties consented to proceed before Magistrate Judges in 103 cases through the Voluntary Consent to Magistrate Judges Program; all parties consented in 35 cases assigned to the Direct Assignment of Civil Cases to Magistrate Judges Program; and, there were four cases where all parties consented to proceed before Magistrate Judges in other civil cases.

In calendar year 2020, Magistrate Judges held 307 settlement conferences in 272 cases. Of these, the Magistrate Judges settled 130 cases for a 48 percent settlement rate. The Magistrate Judges spent 1,873 hours, equivalent to 234 8-hour-work days, on settling these cases.

In calendar year 2020, eight District Judges participated in the Patent Pilot Program in the Central District of California. In 2020, the Judges designated to receive patent cases under the Patent Pilot Program received 203 patent cases, of which 62 were initially assigned to them, 84 cases were transferred to the program from non-participating Judges, and 57 cases were transferred to the program as a result of related case transfers or other reasons. The number of patent cases filed in calendar year 2020 decreased by 17.2 percent, and the number of cases transferred to the program by non-participating Judges decreased by 3.4 percent from 2019. In 2020, the percentage of patent cases filed that were assigned or transferred to Judges participating in the Patent Pilot Program was 75.2 percent. Since the start of the Patent Pilot Program in September of 2011, a total of 1,910 patent cases have been assigned to participating judges.

In calendar year 2020, the Central District of California saw a 9.3 percent decrease in attorneys admitted to the bar of the Court. During the five-year period ending December 31, 2020, the number of attorneys admitted to practice in the Central District of California was at its highest in 2018 at 2,468.

In calendar year 2020 a total of 50 trials were held before all Judges in the Central District of California, a 72 percent decrease from 2019 primarily as a result of the suspension of jury trials due to the OVID-19 pandemic. Of the 50 trials, 56 percent were bench trials, and 44 percent were jury trials. From 2019 to 2020, civil jury trials dropped 86 percent; civil bench trials decreased 36 percent; criminal jury trials decreased 78 percent, and criminal bench trials decreased by 83 percent. During the five-year period ending December 31, 2020, trials decreased 76 percent overall.

In calendar year 2020, there were 5,049 jurors in attendance for the Central District of California, a 74.5 percent decrease from 2019 as a result of the suspension of jury trials and grand jury proceedings due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Over the five-year period ending December 31, 2020, the number of jurors in attendance decreased 78 percent from 23,058 in 2016.

In calendar year 2020, the Central District of California naturalized 17,057 citizens, a 77 percent drop from 73,044 in 2019 as a result of the suspension of naturalization ceremonies due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Over the five-year period ending December 31, 2020, the Central District of California naturalized over 329,270 citizens.
