


Annual Report of Caseload Statistics

Fiscal Year 2023

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Weighted Filings per Judgeship



The number of weighted filings per judgeship for the Central District of California increased to 596 for fiscal year¹ ("FY") 2023, an increase of 6 percent from 560 in the prior year. Overall, weighted filings have decreased 12 percent over the five-year period from FY2019 to FY2023. The Central District of California's weighted filings per judgeship was 8.6 percent higher than the national average of 549. The Central District of California ranked 17th in the nation and 2nd in the Ninth Circuit for weighted filings in FY2023.

The Central District of California has 28 authorized Article III judgeships. At the end of FY2023, the Central District had 2 vacancies. At the end of FY 2023, the number of vacant judgeship months was 38.2 months. From FY 2019 to FY 2023, vacant judgeship months have decreased 59.7 percent. Vacant judgeship months are the total number of months that vacancies occurred in any judgeship position in a circuit or district, as defined in the, 'Federal Court Management Statistics.'



In FY2023, the Central District of California saw a 10.5 percent increase in combined civil and criminal case filings from FY2022. Total case terminations increased 4.1 percent and total pending cases rose 2.3 percent from FY2022. During the five-year period ending September 30, 2023, total civil and criminal case filings decreased by 4.5 percent; total terminations decreased by 4 percent, and total pending cases fell 4.4 percent.


A total of 15,243 civil cases were filed in FY2023, an increase of 11.5 percent from 13,665 in FY2022. Terminations increased 5.1 percent, and pending civil cases rose 3.9 percent from FY2022. During the five-year period ending September 30, 2023, civil case filings decreased 1.7 percent, terminations decreased 2.7 percent, and pending civil cases declined 5.1 percent.





Between FY2019 and FY2023, the total number of criminal case filings dropped 41.9 percent, criminal case terminations fell 25.7 percent, and criminal cases pending decreased 1.5 percent. In FY2023, criminal case filings declined 8.7 percent, criminal defendant filings decreased 11.2 percent, and criminal cases pending also decreased 4 percent from FY2022. During the five-year period ending September 30, 2023, defendant filings dropped 53.1 percent, defendant terminations decreased 22.5 percent, and pending criminal defendants were reduced by 22.4 percent.






Civil Case Filings



All Other Civil case filings constituted the highest percentage of all civil case filing categories at 27 percent in FY2023. There were more All Other Civil, Civil Rights, and Contracts civil cases filed in FY2023; however, there were fewer Forfeiture and Penalties, Antitrust, and Labor Suits filed compared to FY2022. In FY2023, Forfeiture and Penalties case filings decreased 67.4 percent, Antitrust decreased by 33.3 percent, All Other Civil case filings increased 29.7 percent, and Social Security case filings increased 27.6 percent from FY2022.

Civil Case Filings by Nature of Suit






The Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) civil rights filings in FY2023 comprised 13.1 percent of the Central District of California's total civil filings. From FY2022 to FY2023, ADA filings decreased 1.4 percent, while over the five-year period, from FY2019 to FY2023, ADA filings have fallen sharply by 40.8 percent. In fact, from FY2019 through FY2023, while total civil filings decreased 1.7 percent, the percentage of ADA filings to total civil filings fell 39.8 percent.




Civil Removal Filings



A total of 3,122 civil removal cases were filed in FY2023, an increase of 19.3 percent from FY2022. Civil removal filings represented 20.5 percent of the total filings in the Central District of California: 65 percent of the removals were filed in the Western Division; 15 percent were filed in the Southern Division; and 20 percent were filed in the Eastern Division. The largest percentage of civil removal filings were civil rights (25 percent) and contract (24.2 percent) cases.



Non-Prisoner Pro Se Filings




Eleven percent of the 15,243 total civil cases filed in FY2023 were non-prisoner cases with at least one pro se party.² Of these, 25.3 percent were civil rights, 18 percent real property, and 17 percent immigration. During FY2023, 69 percent of the non-prisoner pro se filings were filed in the Western Division, 16 percent were filed in the Eastern Division, and 14 percent were filed in the Southern Division.


Criminal Defendant Filings



In FY2023, criminal defendant filings decreased 11.2 percent from FY2022. The top three major offense categories for criminal defendant filings in FY2023 were drug offenses (28 percent), property offenses (28 percent), and firearms and explosives offenses (18 percent). The number of defendants charged with drug offenses decreased by 21.7 percent, the number of defendants charged with property offenses increased by 9.8 percent, and the number of defendants charged with firearms and explosives offenses decreased by 16.7 percent from FY2022.



Criminal Defendant Filings by Major Offense



Civil Case Filings Referred to Magistrate Judges for Report and Recommendation




In FY2023, 15 percent of the total civil filings were referred to Magistrate Judges for report and recommendations. Of the cases referred for report and recommendations, 25 percent were habeas corpus petitions, 39 percent were Social Security appeal cases, 22 percent were prisoner civil rights cases, 12 percent were non-prisoner pro se civil rights cases, and 2 percent were other cases.




Consents to Magistrate Judges

Parties consented to proceed before Magistrate Judges in a total of 1,092 cases in calendar year 2023, a 36.7 percent increase from 2022. Of this total, all parties consented in 832 cases that were referred to a Magistrate Judge for a report and recommendation; all parties consented to proceed before Magistrate Judges in 146 cases through the Voluntary Consent to Magistrate Judges Program; and all parties consented in 112 cases assigned through the Direct Assignment of Civil Cases to Magistrate Judges Program.



In calendar year 2023, Magistrate Judges held 264 settlement conferences in 224 cases. Of these, the Magistrate Judges settled 88 cases for a 39 percent settlement rate. The Magistrate Judges spent 1,611 hours, equivalent to 201 8-hour-work days, on settling these cases.


In calendar year 2023, six District Judges participated in the Patent Program for the Central District of California. In 2023, the judges designated to receive patent cases under the Patent Program received 120 patent cases, of which 25 were initially assigned to them, 52 cases were transferred to the program from non-participating judges, and 43 cases were transferred to the program because of related case transfers or other reasons. The number of patent cases filed in calendar year 2023 decreased by 21 percent, and the number of cases transferred to the program by non-participating judges decreased by 14.8 percent from 2022. In 2023, the percentage of patent cases filed that were assigned or transferred to Judges participating in the Patent Program was 72 percent. Since the start of the program on September of 2011 as a pilot, a total of 2,310 patent cases have been assigned to participating judges.

In calendar year 2023, the Central District of California saw a 1.5 percent increase in attorneys admitted to the bar of the Court remained steady from 2,333 in calendar year³ 2022 (CY) to 2,368. During the five-year period ending December 31, 2023, the number of attorneys admitted to practice in the Central District of California was at its lowest in 2020 at 2,166.






In calendar year 2023 there were a total of 205 trials held before all District and Magistrate Judges in the Central District of California, a 4 percent increase from 2022. In 2023 of the 205 trials, 160 were jury trials (78 percent) and 45 were bench trials (22 percent). In 2023 civil jury trials increased from 75 in 2022 to 104; civil bench trials decreased from 50 to 42; criminal jury trials decreased from 68 to 56 and criminal bench trials decreased from 5 to 3. During the five-year period ending December 31, 2023, total trials held increased 16 percent from 177 in 2019 to 205 in 2023.



In calendar year 2023, there were 21,681 jurors in attendance for trials held in the Central District of California, a 2.6 percent increase from 2022. Over the five-year period ending December 31, 2023, the number of jurors in attendance increased 9 percent from 19,831 in 2019.

In calendar year 2023, at least 3,123 cases were referred to one of the three ADR options provided in Local Rule 16-15.4. More cases were referred to the Private Mediation Panel than to either of the other available choices. Of the cases referred to the Panel for mediation, more than 14 percent were brought under the Nature of Suit 190, Other Contract.

In 2023, the Central District of California's Mediation Panel was composed of 206 panel members who collectively possessed substantive experience in more than 25 areas of law. Panel mediators conducted at least 539 mediation sessions in calendar year 2023. Of these, 214 sessions were reported to have resulted in settlement or partial settlement, and 325 sessions were reported not to have resulted in immediate settlement, for a settlement rate of 40 percent.
